Modern Slavery Statement

Scania (Great Britain) Limited “**SGB**” is a private limited company incorporated in England and Wales.

Under the Modern Slavery Act 2015 SGB is required to publish a Modern Slavery Statement for each financial year setting out the steps it has taken to address the risk of slavery or human trafficking occurring within its own operations and within the supply chain.

This is the statement for SGB for the year ended 31st December 2016.

SGB Policy

SGB has a zero tolerance approach to any form of modern slavery. SGB is committed to conducting business with integrity and in a socially responsible and sustainable way. This includes upholding the United Nation’s Global Compact’s principles relating to human rights, labour practices, the environment and anti-corruption.

SGB is committed to acting in an ethical manner, with integrity and transparency in all business dealings and is committed to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of modern slavery taking place within its business or supply chain.

Code of Conduct

SGB employees and suppliers are expected to respect the Code of Conduct issued by SGB. This is available at www.scania.com/uk/en/businesswithscania and specifies the expected behaviour of all its business partners with regard to social and environmental standards.

This code specifically requires SGB and its Suppliers to ensure that the following minimum standards are met;

- Not to tolerate any form of modern slavery, child, forced, bonded or compulsory labour or servitude by or in relation to the Suppliers employees, the Supplier’s suppliers.
- Not to be involved in any human trafficking activity

As part of the UK tendering and supplier approval process, business partners confirm that they will comply with the terms of the SGB Code of Conduct.



Standard Contract Terms

SGB's standard contract terms contain clauses requiring strict compliance with the provisions of the Modern Slavery Act, the UN Global Compact and the SGB Code of Conduct. Where a Suppliers' own terms are agreed, a new process has been introduced to ensure these clauses are incorporated in to the agreement.

Summary

This statement outlines some of the actions undertaken by SGB as part of its commitment to eradicating Modern Slavery in all aspects of its business. It is intended that this statement will evolve over time and demonstrate progress on this important issue.

This statement has been approved by the board of SGB who will review and update as necessary on an annual basis.
